BULLETIN INSERTS FOR THE LITURGICAL LIFE OF THE PARISH

St Cecilia has obtained a series of bulletin inserts which discuss and explain aspects of our beliefs, and traditions. There are numerous subject matters in this series, there will be a subject of interest for everybody.

The Parts of the Mass “ANNOUNCEMENTS”

Before Mass is over, we usually hear a few announcements. They are a sign that the community who worships together maintains a vibrant life during the week. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our life. It gathers our week's activities into a hymn of praise and it sends us forth to proclaim the Gospel to all we meet. We hear many of those opportunities in the announcements. Announcements take place following the Prayer after Communion and before the final Greeting and Blessing. Although it's tempting to break the silence after Communion with announcements while everyone is seated, that time has its own purpose— to thank God for the Eucharist we share.

That important period of thanksgiving stands apart on its own. The Prayer after Communion concludes those silent prayers. Then, when Communion is done, and before we are dismissed, we hear the announcements.

For similar reasons, the announcements should not be made as part of the homily. Although everyone is seated and ready to listen, this time has a different purpose. The homily comments on the word of God; this unit within the Mass should not suffer from interruption. The priest, the deacon, or another minister may let us know what is happening this week. Ordinarily the assembly remains standing, but if the announcements are long, they may be invited to sit.

The announcements should be made from some place other than the ambo; we reserve the ambo for the reading and preaching of Sacred Scripture. There are no rules for what should be included or omitted. The announcements provide an opportunity for highlighting some information that can be detailed in the bulletin. They are intended to be brief. Those who leave Mass early miss this important time. All who share Communion are summoned into service. The announcements extend an Invitation to let our Communion take root in the community.

Today’s readings remind us of the life-giving qualities received by those who follow God’s teachings and who trust in God’s goodness. St. Francis de Sales similarly notes: “The greater our trust in God, the more life-giving is our spirit. If we are to allow God’s love to operate in us, we must make room in our heart so that the Holy Spirit may flood our heart with holy love. When our concerns and responsibilities are full of anxiety and fear, we limit our ability to act in the way God desires us to act.”

What are we to do if we have the desire to serve God but lack sufficient strength to put that desire into practice? Offer this desire to God. God renews our desire as often as is necessary to make us persevere in our desire to do God’s Will. Placing our trust in God’s goodness makes us eventually capable of acting on our desire to belong to God.

I am not saying that you must always **feel** this determination to belong entirely to God. We may always have feelings of reluctance to the events in our life that God does not desire but permits. Do not be troubled by such feelings, for few people are able to get rid of them. Yet, you ought to constantly **recognize** that you belong to God even though you do not always feel that way. We must deliberately choose to keep ourselves focused on the goal to belong to God alone. As we focus on pursuing our goal, our reluctant feelings will gradually be transformed as we allow God’s love to flood our heart.

Let us frequently place our good will in God’s hands, and God will renew our true willingness as often as is necessary in this mortal life. Those who place themselves peacefully in the hands of God’s Providence let themselves move forward, like a person sleeping in a ship that never stops moving forward on a tranquil sea. Blessed are they who put their trust in God, for confidence in God brings life to their human spirit!

Safe Environment Training Is Mandatory For New Volunteers

The Diocese of Venice is committed to provide a safe environment for children and vulnerable adults. To that end, persons working with children or visiting vulnerable adults, as well as any volunteer for any ministry, are required to be fingerprinted (this process includes a background check) and to receive training in recognizing potential signs of abuse. The training portion can be done in your home over a PC.

For further information, visit the Diocesan website at www.dioceseofvenice.org/safeenvironment to see what is required before the parish can accept a volunteer into any ministry. Any cost a volunteer incurs to complete these requirements will be fully reimbursed on request. Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. To report abuse by Diocesan personnel or volunteers also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941 416 6114.

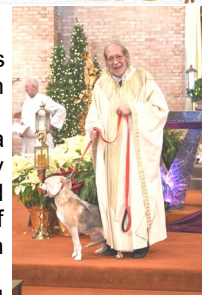

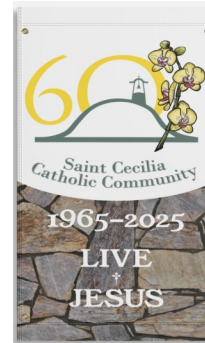
Judith Zeterberg

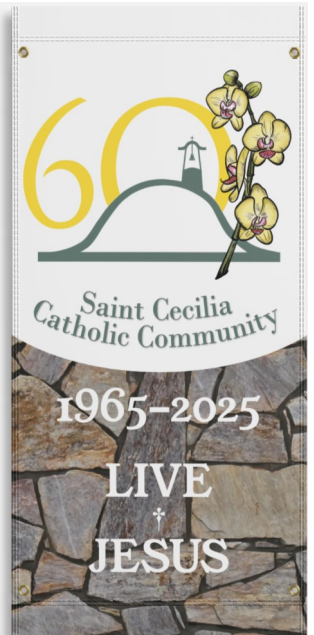
