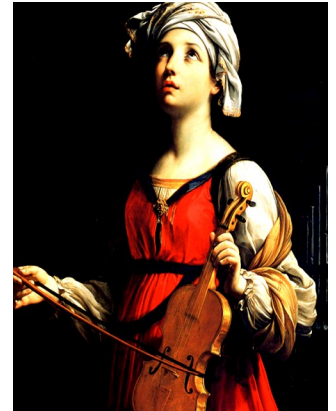

The Parts of the Mass

BEGOTTEN

The word *begotten* refers to the role the father has played in producing a child. Sometimes the words in the Mass refer to Jesus as the only begotten Son of the Father. It sounds redundant—if you are a son, you have been begotten. But the issue here is to point out just who the father is.

Christianity has survived many heresies throughout its history. One of them pertained to the Father of Jesus. This heresy, known as adoptionism, believed that Jesus was born of two human parents, the same way every human being is born. But because he was so unusual in his faith and abilities, God adopted him to become his own Son. This is not what mainstream Christianity believes. We believe that the Father of Jesus is divine, no human. We also believe that no one else has God as a Father in exactly the same way. Consequently, we speak of Jesus as the only-begotten Son of God.

We have used the word in the Nicene Creed for quite a few years, but the revised English Translation of the Mass had added it to the Gloria as well. It has always been in there in Latin, but the first translators perhaps thought that the word was unnecessary. However, it is a critical part of the history of Christianity, and it has always appeared in the text of the Gloria, a hymn that is over a thousand years old. It reappears now in the Gloria, and in some other prayers throughout the Missal. Although *begotten* is a word we do not often use, it pertains to a belief upon which we stand: God is the Father of Jesus, and he is the only Son of God.

From 1990 to 2012, he taught moral theology at the Washington Theological Union. Since 2013 he has been on the preaching staff at San Alfonso Retreat House in Long Branch, New Jersey.

He co-authored with Fr. Peter Black, *The Essential Moral Handbook and Life, Death, and Catholic Medical Choices*.

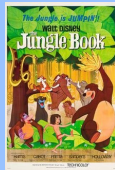

We must ask God to help us love others, especially those for whom we have no inclination to love. They will have a more abundant life by the example you give them.

Since God wants us to love and cherish others, we must see God's love in our neighbor. Even though at first we seem reluctant to do so, we must not give up practicing this love of neighbor outwardly. But we must not be surprised if we find ourselves not equally kind and gentle. Be patient with everyone's imperfections but especially your own. Have the courage to pick yourself up after a fall. There's no better way to grow in God's love than to always start over again and never think that we have done enough.

Do not worry whether or not your work will bear the fruit you intend to produce, for you will not be asked for the fruit. You will only be asked if you faithfully occupied yourself in cultivating well these barren and arid lands. You will not be asked whether you have gathered in a harvest, but only if you have taken sufficient care to sow the seed.

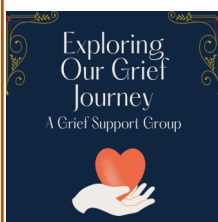

Safe Environment Training Is Mandatory For New Volunteers

The Diocese of Venice is committed to provide a safe environment for children and vulnerable adults. To that end, persons working with children or visiting vulnerable adults, as well as any volunteer for any ministry, are required to be fingerprinted (this process includes a background check) and to receive training in recognizing potential signs of abuse. The training portion can be done in your home over a PC.

For further information, visit the Diocesan website at www.dioceseofvenice.org/safeenvironment to see what is required before the parish can accept a volunteer into any ministry. Any cost a volunteer incurs to complete these requirements will be fully reimbursed on request. Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. To report abuse by Diocesan personnel or volunteers also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941 416 6114.

The Knight's Corner

Supreme has designated Venerable Frederic Baraga Catholic Man of the Month.

Nothing could stop Father Frederic Baraga from sharing the truth of his Catholic faith. As a young priest in Slovenia, he defended the faith against the Jansenist heresy. As a missionary, he later traveled hundreds of miles on foot throughout northern Michigan, where he became known as the "Snowshoe Priest" and the "Apostle of the Lakelands."

Baraga was the fourth of five siblings, born in 1797 to a wealthy family in Slovenia. Both of his parents died by the time he turned 16. A gifted student, fluent in several languages, he went on to study law at the University of Vienna. Inspired by St. Clement Hofbauer, then living in Vienna, he entered seminary and was ordained for the Diocese of Ljubljana two years later, in 1823. After ministering in Slovenia for seven years, he was drawn to serve in mission territories and arrived in the United States on New Year's Eve 1830.

Among Father Baraga's first assignments was serving an Odawa Indigenous community in the present-day Cross Village, Michigan. He used his legal background in defense of Native Americans and would publish 20 books in Indigenous languages over the course of his ministry. On one occasion, he walked 57 miles through the snow to baptize an Indigenous girl who was dying.

Beginning in 1840, he also served immigrants to Michigan's Upper Peninsula. He would start each day at 3 or 4 a.m., praying for several hours before embarking on his missionary duties. He once wrote, "What a consolation, what ineffable bliss, to gain immortal souls for Jesus Christ".

In 1853, Father Baraga was named bishop of the Diocese of Marquette, where he served until his death on January 19, 1868 at the age of 70. He was declared venerable in 2012.

Our Council here at Saint Cecilians meets on the second Tuesday of every month in the Parish Hall at 7:00 PM, so come join us. See what we are all about and what you have been missing as an adult Catholic Christian.

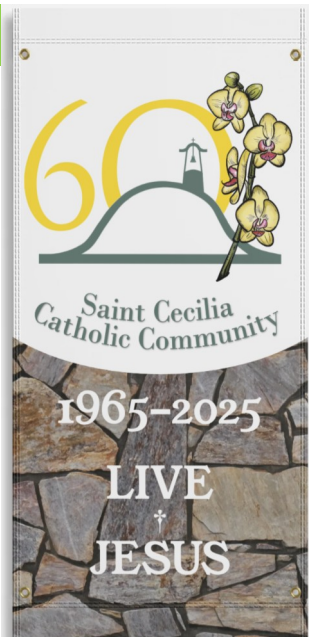
