BULLETIN INSERTS FOR THE LITURGICAL LIFE OF THE PARISH

The Parts of the Mass BRINGING UP THE GIFTS

At the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the bread, wine, and offerings for the Church and the poor are brought to the altar. Sometimes the bread and wine are placed on the credence table before Mass. In this case, a minister brings them to the altar at the Preparation of the Gifts. More commonly, the bread and wine are placed near the door of the church before Mass. They may be brought up in procession to the altar.

The procession should include just these primary symbols. It is permissible to carry up the water in the procession, but ideally, it is already in place before Mass together with the bowl, towel, and chalice. The procession of the Gifts is not a setting of the credence table. It begins the preparation of the offerings for Masses.

Similarly, symbolic tokens that will be retrieved and put back into use after Mass should not be brought up in procession. Textbooks, sports paraphernalia, and hobbies, for example, might be arranged to catch the eye upon entering the church for a school Mass, but they are not the gifts of the Eucharist.

Gifts are brought up in procession by "the faithful", who hand them to the priest or deacon (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 73). After handing them over, some people make the Sign of the Cross, genuflect, bow or do none of the above. The GIRM gives no instructions about what to do. The *Ceremonial of Bishops* says, "A deep bow is made to the altar by all who enter the sanctuary (chancel), leave it, or pass before the altar" (72). It would be most appropriate if those who bring up the gifts made a profound bow to the altar just before returning to their places.

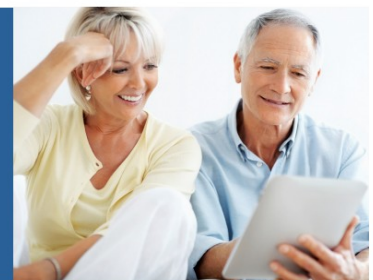

HE LOVED US FIRST: A renewal of devotion to the Sacred Heart helps us grasp God's unflinching love for us and our own identity in Christ. The Knights of Columbus will begin its newest Pilgrim Icon Program, featuring the most famous depiction of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Painted in 1760 by Pompeo Batoni, the original image is now venerated in the Church of the Gesu' in Rome. In the painting, inspired by the mystical visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus holds out His heart, which is enflamed with love and surrounded by a crown of thorns. Framed copies of this image, each bearing the apostolic blessing of Pope Francis, will travel between Councils and Parishes in every jurisdiction of our Order. One might be tempted to think of devotion to the Sacred Heart as outdated or perhaps overly sentimental, but nothing could be further from the truth. It is, rather relevant as ever in its focus on the timeless and bold promise that God has made to us - a love that brings us new life and eternal salvation through the life, death and resurrection of his only begotten Son, Jesus Christ. Christ meets us in our human weakness, and His Sacred Heart touches and brings unity to our own hearts, which are wounded and often broken.

Our Council here at Saint Cecilia meets on the second Tuesday of every month in the Parish Hall at 7:00 PM, so come join us. See what we are all about and what you have been missing as an adult Catholic Christian.

I told Pat Cyr, who was the lead Bereavement Minister at that time, that I was ready to join her ministry. I felt that was the place for me and the need was great for that ministry also. In time, I joined many more ministries, but bereavement remains closet to my heart.

And so, thanks to Carol (now deceased) and Pat and Fr Stan and Fr. Frank (and eventually Fr. Paul) and the staff, I am so grateful for your warmth, hugs, smiles and all you parishioners, I thank you for your help in my healing and I make it my responsibility to do the same for others.

Thank you Saint Cecilia Catholic Community.

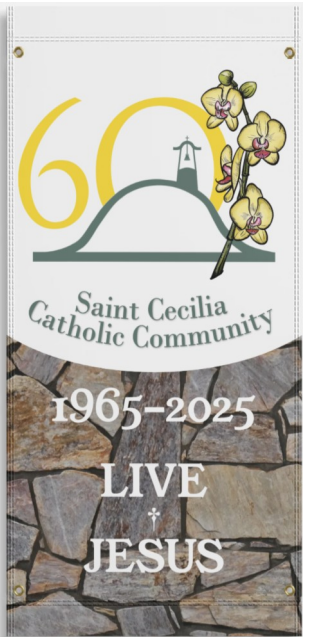
