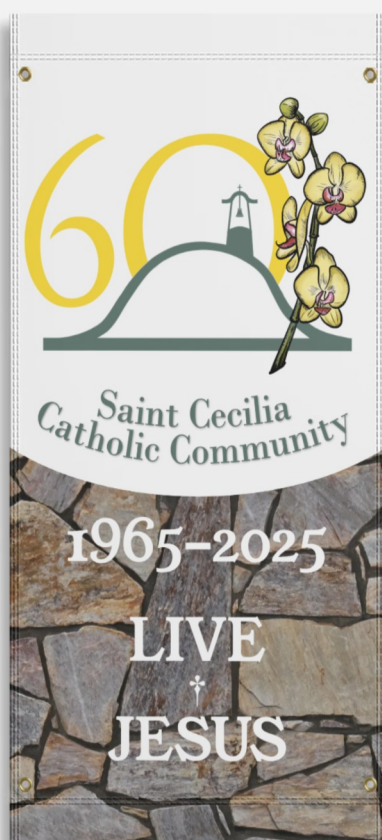

INTRODUCTORY RITES

The Introductory Rites help the assembly become a worshiping community. They also prepare us to hear God's word and celebrate the Eucharist.

There are several elements to the Introductory Rites of Mass. The cantor or another minister may introduce the liturgy. We sing the Entrance Song and make the Sign of the Cross. The presider greets us. The Penitential Act or the blessing and sprinkling with holy water follow. We sing the Glory to God. Finally, the presider offers the Collect. A lot happens in just a few minutes.

The cantor's introduction may tell us about the music, the special nature of the celebration or the ministers of the day. Some communities invite members to greet one another.

The Entrance Song sets the tone of the celebration. We may sing a seasonal hymn or one that refers to the Scriptures of the day.

We sign ourselves with the Cross, and the presider greets us with a phrase such as, "The Lord be with you." Christians can trace that gesture and those words to the earliest days of the Church.

The Penitential Act or the sprinkling of water symbolizes our desire to enter this celebration in purity of heart.

On most Sundays, we sing or recite the Glory to God in praise of the Trinity. This hymn comes immediately after the Penitential Act, causing us to shift moods rather quickly.

The Introductory Rites all lead to the Collect. When the presider says, "Let us pray," we pause in silence to pray. This prayer explains why we come for this Mass and gives God praise. It brings the Introductory Rites to a fitting close.

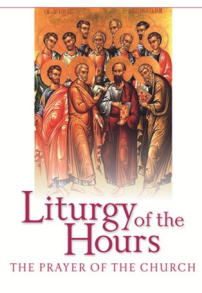
Praying the Liturgy of the Hours

The Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God (Opus Dei), is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. The Hours are a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using scripture and prayer."

"Share with the Lord's people who are in need."
(Romans 12:13)



As we approach the end of the Church year, the Scripture readings begin to call our attention to the end-times. They remind us that Jesus came among us to inaugurate the kingdom of God. Through the sacrifice he offered on the cross, our sins have been forgiven and we have been reconciled with our Father. We have been given a share in Jesus' new life and that makes us children of the kingdom of God who are journeying home to our Father's house.

This Eucharist allows us to share in the one sacrifice of Jesus, to open ourselves once again to the grace of salvation, to reconcile ourselves more deeply with our Father and with one another, and to be nourished with the bread of life for our continuing journey home.

The word and sacrament we share here today can help us to keep our minds and hearts focused on Jesus and his words to us. That focus will enable us to avoid the agitation and anxiety many people around us experience as we hear talk of the end times. We hear many claims about special revelations concerning the end of the world. The apocalyptic message of the Scriptures has always raised these kinds of claims. They disturb many good people. Jesus tells us very clearly today: "By patient endurance you will save your lives."

How should we deal with these times? First, it's a time to be thankful. God's plan of salvation is moving closer to its completion, as it does each day. It's also a time for us to rededicate ourselves to living out our faith commitment more fully each day: praying for deeper faith in God's continuing love for us and reflecting that love in the way we live with each other.

There's really no reason for us to be afraid or become anxious about endings. We believe that the grace of salvation given to us in baptism, strengthened in us by confirmation, and nourished in us by Eucharist is leading us home to be with our Father. While death is an ending to our earthly existence, we already possess the gift of eternal life by God's grace. Our only real end is to be with our God forever.

So let us take heart and patiently resolve to live each day with faith. Let us love our God with our whole being and love one another as Jesus has loved us. Our patient endurance will lead us to salvation. In this way, our journey home will be a safe and sure one.

Safe Environment Training Is Mandatory For New Volunteers



The Diocese of Venice is committed to provide a safe environment for children and vulnerable adults. To that end, persons working with children or visiting vulnerable adults, as well as any volunteer for any ministry, are required to be fingerprinted (this process includes a background check) and to receive training in recognizing potential signs of abuse. The training portion can be done in your home over a PC.

For further information, visit the Diocesan website at www.dioceseofvenice.org/safeenvironment to see what is required before the parish can accept a volunteer into any ministry. Any cost a volunteer incurs to complete these requirements will be fully reimbursed on request. Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. To report abuse by Diocesan personnel or volunteers also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at (941) 416 - 6114.

52 Stories Dave Herrington

In 2011, Our fellow parishioner, Dave Herrington, was asked to write a piece for DeSales World, a publication of the Oblates of St Francis de Sales. We have re-printed that article below.

In 2011 my wife Jane and I visited the De Sales Centre Oblate Community at Childs, Maryland to pay our respects to six of our beloved Oblate friends : Fathers Joe Beattie, John Beattie, John (Jack Doyle), Angelo Maraldo, Willard Rucinski and Richard (Rick) Wojnicki. We personally knew these men during their assignments in Ft. Myers, FL. We visited their graves, touring Annecy Hall and the total complex, stopping periodically to thank the caregivers for their love and support to those Oblates who spend their final years there.

When I joined the Catholic Church in 1993, I was an "old Christian and a new Catholic." Jane completed her RCIA process at St Cecilia Catholic Community staffed by the Oblates in Fort Myers and was welcomed into the church on the Solemnity of Christ the King in 1993.

Joining St Cecilia's was a very easy decision after our first visit. The Mass was awesome; we could feel the Holy Spirit in the assembly; the laity was involved in the Liturgy; the homily was thought provoking; the music was joyful; and the Eucharist was a beautiful, thankful celebration.

Shortly after we joined, we both were honored and grateful at the invitation to be Eucharistic Ministers. Later I was blessed to bring the Eucharist to parishioners who were in the hospital or homebound. The blessing of sharing Jesus through the Eucharist, prayers and conversation was indeed an indescribable gift from God.

All the Oblates, in their own way, have significantly helped me to strive to Live Jesus. We saw something in the Oblates and we wanted it; they introduced us to St. Francis de Sales and they have continued to be my mentors and companions since.

In 1999, when Fr Michael Murray asked me to assist in spreading Salesian Spirituality in Southwest Florida I had the opportunity to get to know and love St. Francis through many resources including books written by him and about him. My most important resource was the friendships with the many Oblates who have ministered to parishes, a high school, college and university here in SW Florida. I am deeply indebted to them for sharing their talents and friendship. Fr. Stan Dombrowski, who was my pastor and friend for many years, was especially helpful and patient in getting me organized and was a continual resource and support for all the programs.

The Salesian Heart is defined as the deepest core of a person, one's heart-center, where intellect and will, reason and affections, "head and heart" are seen as one. Salesian Spirituality is first and foremost of the Heart. The Oblates of St Francis de Sales have stretched my heart.

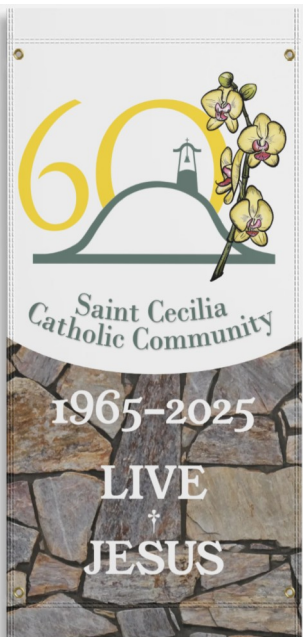
I close with an invitation. If you have an opportunity to come to Fort Myers, come join us at St Cecilia. You will be welcomed .
