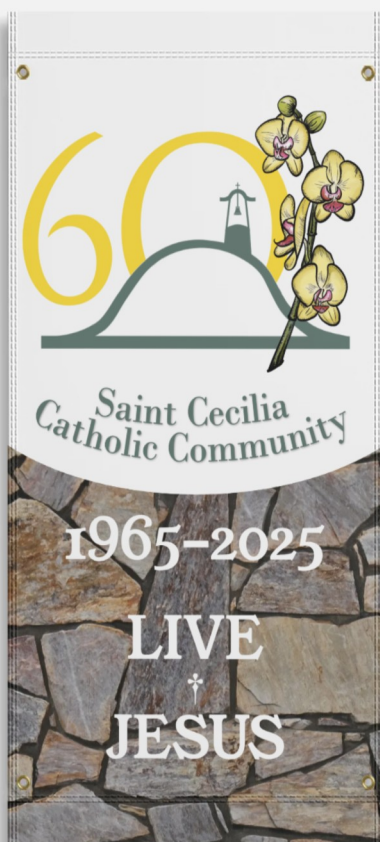

SILENCE IN THE CHAPEL

One of the things about St. Cecilia which draws people to our parish is the "community feeling" people get when they arrive and are warmly greeted and welcomed as they enter and can catch up with other parishioners. It is a wonderful thing! Yet it can be a bit loud and distracting, especially for someone who needs some quiet time to commune with the Lord in prayer before Mass begins.

Beginning the first Sunday of Advent, November 30, 2025 in order to provide a quiet space for those who want to silently pray before mass and also a space for the exuberant welcoming which is so much a part of St. Cecilia, I ask that the left/south wing of the church building (where the weekday chapel is located) be kept as a "quiet" section before Mass begins to provide that space for those who seek it while the rest of the church building can be used for greeting, catching up, telling stories, hugging, etc.

Hearing Scripture

Imagine you're with a group of friends swapping stories about recent trips. But each of you brings a written copy for everyone else. When it's your turn, you don't tell the story while everyone listens. Instead, everybody pulls out your written account and reads along with you while you speak. Sound like fun? Sorry, that's not how we tell stories. Listening is an art as rich as reading. We still do it in classrooms, seminars, phone conversations and the living room. Lively interaction between speaker and listener means the speaker proclaims ideas and the listener gives attention. In that low-tech communication, human beings connect. The proclamation of Scripture recaptures the age-old art of speaking and listening. God's presence appears in the assembly as word. In actively listening to the Word of God, as we naturally do in conversation, we open our hearts to wonder. Technology has made the mass production of written materials more available now than ever. With little effort, Scripture readings can be placed in the hands of every worshiper. Advocates of this practice say it permits the worshiper to see sight, not just hearing. However, it's like having everyone read your trip story while you tell it. It can let the air out. The event requires both the proclamation of the reader and the eagerness of listeners. Hearing the word together bonds and expresses our community. If everyone reads the text silently, we become individuals again, with noses in our laps and faces turned down from one another. We'll hear the Word of God with better attention if we prepare. Worshipers can read the texts prior to coming to Mass and pray over them throughout the week before. We may also discuss them with family and friends. Then our ears will be open to listen attentively to the Word of God. All eyes will be fixed on the one who reads. And our hearts will be joined as one body of believers. When the divine word resounds in our assembly—heads up! And listen.

Praying the Liturgy of the Hours

The Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God (Opus Dei), is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. The Hours are a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using scripture and prayer."

In his letter to the Colossians, St. Paul reminds us that we have been made worthy to come into the kingdom of Jesus through his death on the cross and his rising to new life.

Jesus is the center of God's plan of creation: "All were created through him, and for him. He is before all else that is." Jesus is the "image of the invisible God," an obvious reference to Adam's creation in God's image. Jesus, then, is the ideal human being; he shows us our real potential as human beings because of God's great love.

Jesus is also the agent of redemption, the new creation. As he was the firstborn of all creatures, Jesus is also the firstborn from the dead. As all things were created in him, so he reconciles everything in his person. Today we acclaim him head of the Church and ruler of the universe.

The Gospel reading reminds us that Jesus is King, and his throne is the cross. His kingship is one of love and sacrifice, not power and domination.

While we join the Church in acclaiming Jesus as King, the Gospel reminds us that Jesus' reign is ultimately exercised in the mind and heart of each believer. Like the thief on the cross, each of us must recognize Jesus in faith. Like him, our prayer at the moment of death can be: "Jesus, remember me when you enter upon your reign." And Jesus, our redeemer and Lord, will respond with loving compassion: "This day you will be with me in paradise."

But we have work to do now for the building up of Jesus' kingdom. His kingdom is one of justice and peace for every person. Every person, regardless of race or creed or economic status, possesses dignity as an image of God. Everyone has a right and a responsibility to contribute his or her talents in the making of human society.

As faithful disciples of Jesus, you and I are asked to treat everyone with reverence and help them to recognize and respect their own dignity as an image of God. We can also make efforts to help transform our society to be more just and less violent.

May Jesus be King for us – the center of our hearts. May he transform us more completely in his image, so that we are better able to see his image in one another and in everyone we meet.



O God, when I have food, help me to remember the hungry;

When I have work, help me to remember the jobless ;

When I have a home, help me to remember those who have do not. ;

When I am without pain, help me to remember those who suffer, and remembering, help me to destroy my complacency; bestir my compassion, and be concerned enough to help, by word and deed, those who cry out for what we take for granted.

Safe Environment Training Is Mandatory For New Volunteers

The Diocese of Venice is committed to provide a safe environment for children and vulnerable adults. To that end, persons working with children or visiting vulnerable adults, as well as any volunteer for any ministry, are required to be fingerprinted (this process includes a background check) and to receive training in recognizing potential signs of abuse. The training portion can be done in your home over a PC.

For further information, visit the Diocesan website at www.dioceseofvenice.org/safeenvironment to see what is required before the parish can accept a volunteer into any ministry. Any cost a volunteer incurs to complete these requirements will be fully reimbursed

on request. Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. To report abuse by Diocesan personnel or volunteers also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at (941) 416 - 6114.

My first Mass at St. Cecilia's was also Father Tom Murphy's first Mass in 1994. At the time, I was a member of Resurrection Parish and had come to attend Mass with a colleague. I still recall the warm applause when Father Tom announced there would be no more second collections—a joyful moment that soon led me to make St. Cecilia's my spiritual home.

Years later, I was present for Father Stan's first Mass. As Father Tom introduced him, Father Stan stepped from the sacristy and humorously remarked, "I'm here to break up the Irish mafia of Murphy, Devlin, and Doyle." The congregation's laughter marked the beginning of what became a treasured friendship and many years of faith-filled ministry together.

With Father Stan and Father Devlin's guidance, we helped form a young adults' social group that fostered lasting friendships and a deeper sense of parish community. In the years that followed, Father Stan remained a constant presence in my family's life—officiating at our wedding and baptizing our children, even while we lived abroad.

Since returning to Fort Myers in 2016, I have been blessed to serve the parish as a Faith Formation assistant and later to help develop the Marian Hall rental program. Although I stepped away in 2024 to focus on family and community service, I remain active with Sunday Social. My husband, John, serves as an usher at the 4 p.m. Vigil Mass, while our children, Emi and John IV, continue to share their gifts through music and ministry during college.

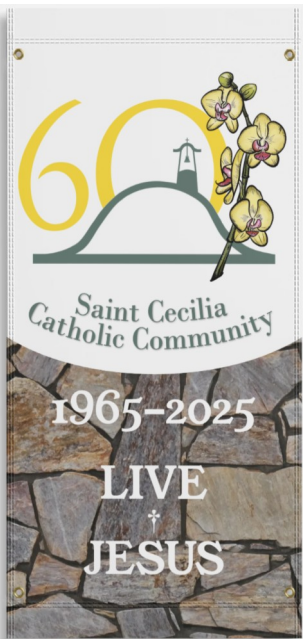


We are going Caroling !!! COME AND JOIN US

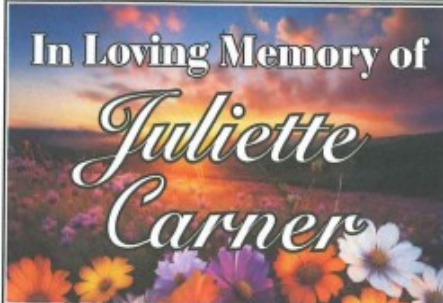
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
