KYRIE

The Penitential Act at Mass always includes some form of the invocations traditionally called the *Kyrie*. The words constitute a brief dialogue in which a leader says, “Lord, have mercy” or “Christ, have mercy,” and the people reply with the same words.

It is thought that the Kyrie’s placement settled at the beginning of Mass after concluding each line of a lengthier litany imploring God’s help for a list of intentions. Thus, it may be the remains of an early form of the Prayer of the Faithful. Throughout most of the history of the Mass, the Kyrie had nine parts: *Kyrie, eleison* three times; *Christe, eleison* three times; and *Kyrie eleison* three times again. It was the only part of a typical Mass that was spoken in Greek instead of Latin. Ever since the 1969 revision of the Mass, the three parts of the Kyrie are said two times each instead of three.

If the assembly recites the Confiteor together at the beginning of Mass, the Kyrie follows. The same is true of the second form of the Penitential Act, a brief dialogue between the priest and the people. More commonly, the Kyrie is embedded within the Penitential Act as the response to a longer invocation. For example, the leader (not necessarily the priest) says, “You came to gather the nations into the peace of God’s kingdom. Lord, have mercy.” All respond, “Lord, have mercy.” Two more invocations follow. This was thought to be closer to the way the Kyrie originated—responses to a series of petitions in the style of a litany. When the Kyrie follows the Confiteor or the brief dialogue, its three phrases may be sung more than twice each, and even when it concludes the invocations, it may always be said or sung in English or in Greek.

THE KNIGHTS' CORNER

College Knights Urged to Be Ambassadors for Christ

The 60th annual College Councils Conference welcomed nearly 200 college Knights to New Haven, Connecticut under the theme "Ambassadors for Christ".

The event opened with an awards dinner on Friday night and continued through the weekend with daily Mass, panel discussions, guest lectures, and opportunities for prayer and fraternity.

In his keynote address Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly pointed to a growing crisis among men, made worse by digital distractions – and the need for authentic, virtue-based friendships as its remedy.

"A true friend desires only what is best for you-he desires that you become the man that God has created you to be," he said. "These are the friends who spur you on to acts of greatness"

The supreme knight contrasted the example of St. Pier Giorgio Frassati, canonized on September 7th, with the tragic case of Tyler Robinson, the 22-year-old Utah man in custody for the assignation of Charlie Kirk, founder of Turning Point USA.

Tyler Robinson didn't have friends who encouraged him in virtue and holiness, he said. "Nor did he have the most important friendship of all-the friendship with Jesus Christ.

He added, "Always be ready to help those who aren't your friends-at least not your friends yet. Do all you can to be there for these young men around who are struggling in the darkness".

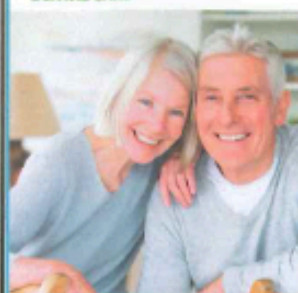
