Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2026, and ends prior to the celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 2, 2026. The Lenten Season is a time for prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of our Faith.

The Season of Lent has a twofold character: [1] by recalling or preparing for baptism and [2] by penance; it disposes the faithful, who more diligently hear the word of God and devote themselves to prayer, to celebrate the paschal mystery (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium, no. 109).

In planning for the Season of Lent, the Triduum, and the Easter Season, it would be helpful to view the Seasons as a whole with the Parish Liturgy Committee and Music Director. A pertinent reference for planning these Seasons is found in the Florida 2026 Ordo: The Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and Celebration of the Eucharist beginning on page 61. Reference to the Florida Ordo is found throughout this Lent/Easter Newsletter.

The precept of confessing grave sins and receiving Holy Communion at least once during the Easter Season indeed merits a reminder to the faithful. To facilitate this requirement, every Parish in the Diocese of Venice must be open with a confessor present on Friday, March 27, 2026, from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., and Saturday, March 28, 2026, from 9:00 a.m. to Noon. This is the minimum requirement for all Parishes. It is encouraged that additional times for the Sacrament also be provided so that the faithful may find ample opportunity to receive God's mercy in the Sacrament.

PENITENTIAL ACT

Near the beginning of Mass, the priest leads the people in the Penitential Act, in which all acknowledge their sins and place their trust in God's mercy.

The Missal provides three options, each following the priest's invitation to acknowledge sins and a brief period of silent reflection.

The first option is commonly called the *Confiteor* because of its first word in Latin. All together confess that they have sinned, while requesting the prayers of others. Although many Catholics strike their breast three times while acknowledging their fault, the Missal calls for only one strike.

The second option is a brief dialogue between the priest and the people, drawn primarily from the Book of Psalms. Of the three options, this is the most rarely used because not many congregations have learned the responses.

In the third option the priest, deacon, cantor, or other minister leads a brief litany praising Christ for his actions, titles, or promises. After each invocation, the minister says, "Lord, have mercy" or "Christ, have mercy," and all respond with the same appeal. The Missal provides several sample formulas, but the local community may compose its own. The litany is not about how sinful we are, but about how merciful Christ is.

Each option concludes with a formula of mercy spoken by the priest. It carries the traditional title "absolution," but it lacks the force of the Sacrament of Penance.

The Kyrie is sung or recited after the first two options of the Penitential Act. It is absorbed into the third.

On certain occasions (e.g., Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Rite of Acceptance, Baptisms, and weddings), the Penitential Act is omitted because of some other ceremony taking place at the beginning or later in the Mass.

REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2026, and Good Friday, April 3, 2026, are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING

Mandatory For New Volunteers

The Diocese of Venice is committed to provide a safe environment for children and vulnerable adults. To that end, persons working with children or visiting vulnerable adults, as well as any volunteer for any ministry, are required to be finger printed (this process includes a background check) and to receive training in recognizing potential signs of abuse. The training portion can be done in your home over a PC.

For further information, visit the Diocesan website at www.dioceseofvenice.org/safeenvironment to see what is required before the parish can accept a volunteer into any ministry. Any cost a volunteer incurs to complete these requirements will be fully reimbursed on request. Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. **OBLATES OF
ST FRANCIS DE SALES**

Today the Responsorial Psalm tells us to "Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord." St. Francis de Sales elaborates on this intention:

How do we "follow the law of the LORD" so as to live well? First, we must purify all our intentions as far as we can. We must make a firm purpose to use the day well for the intention of living as best we can in conformity with God's ways. Anticipate what tasks, transactions and occasions for serving God you may meet today. What temptations will you be exposed to, such as anger, self-centered love, or some other irregularities? Carefully prepare yourself to avoid, resist, and overcome whatever might hinder you from authentically living Jesus.

To follow the law of the Lord, first make a holy resolution to grow in the love Jesus exemplified. To prepare yourself to put this resolution into practice, ask our Savior to help you make the best use of the means available to you to grow in holy love, and serve Him. Admit that you alone cannot carry out your decision to avoid evil and do the good that God desires of you. Hold your heart in your hands and offer it with your good desires to Our Savior. Ask Him to take your heart under His protection and strengthen it so to grow in His authentic love.

To follow the law of the Lord, train yourself to pray. Receive the sacraments often. As you perform the important tasks of your vocation, never forget to practice humility, gentleness, patience, and simplicity, virtues that grow like flowers at the foot of the Cross.

As you care for your family with all the diligence required, bring these souls to love God by infusing good inspirations into their hearts. Great opportunities to serve God rarely present themselves but little ones are frequent. As you carry out your responsibilities so that they give glory to God, all your activities, even eating, drinking, sleeping or recreation, will be done in the name of God, who leads you to authentic wholeness through Jesus Christ.



THE KNIGHTS CORNER




