

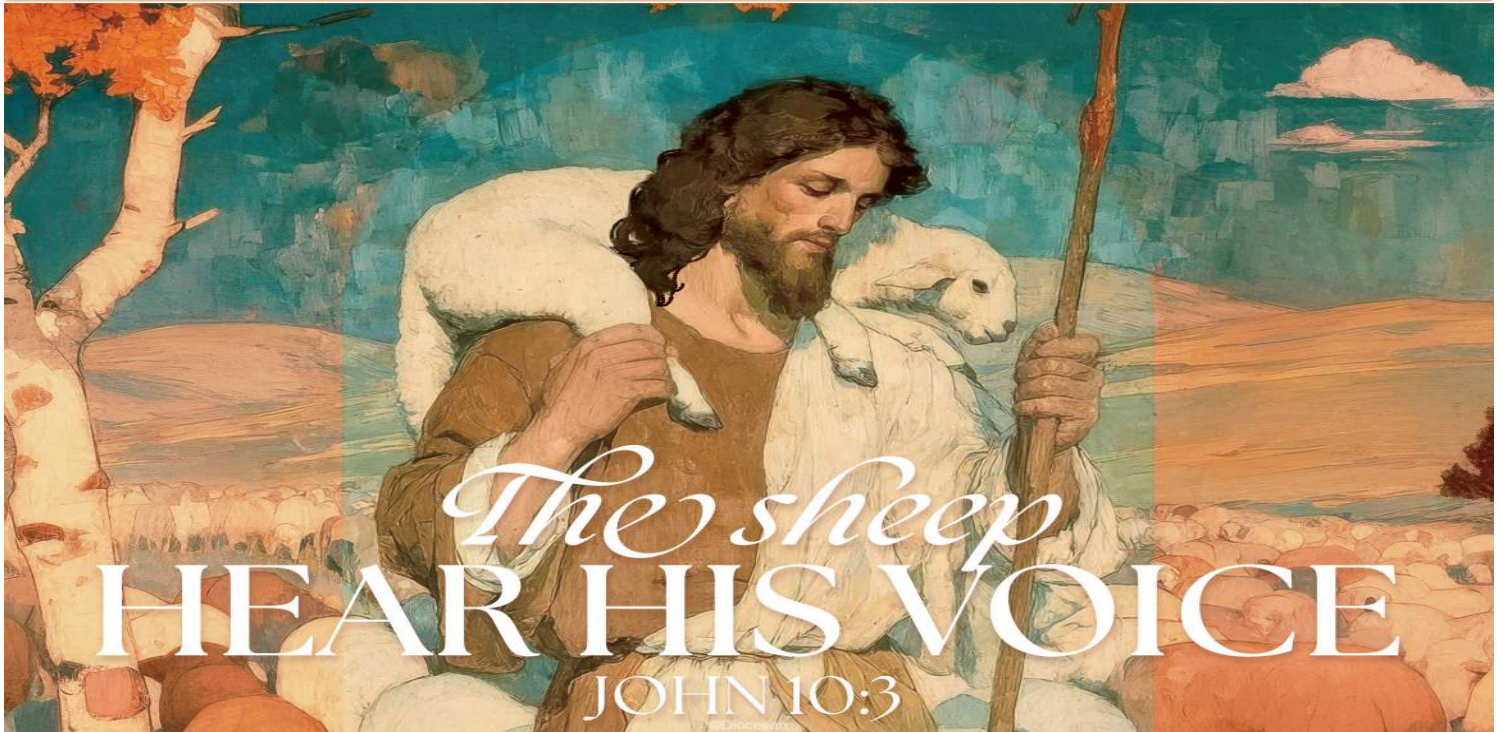

## Celebrating the Lord's Day Part II: The Sunday Eucharist

The primary way in which we celebrate the Lord's Day is with our participation in the Sunday Eucharist. What better way to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord than by celebration of the memorial of his Passion death, and Resurrection?

This celebration is not a solitary, private event. Instead, we come together as the People of God, the Church, to worship with one heart and one voice. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches that "participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church" (CCC, no. 2182).

When members of our church community are absent from this gathering, they are missed. No member of the faithful should be absent from the Sunday Eucharist without a serious reason. The Liturgy should be the first thing on Sunday's schedule, not the last. We should arrive on time, prepared in mind and heart to fully participate in the Mass. Those who cannot attend because of illness or the need to care for infants or the sick deserve our prayers and special attention.

Often, people will suggest that going to Sunday Mass is not necessary. After all, they can pray at home just as well. This has clearly been an issue in the Church for more than a millennium. In the fourth century, St. John Chrysostom addressed this problem directly:

*"You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests."*  
(CCC, no. 2179, quoting St. John Chrysostom, De incomprehensibili 3, 6: PG 48, 725)

Private prayer, though essential to the spiritual life, can never replace the celebration of the Eucharistic Liturgy and the reception of Holy Communion...

**OBLATES OF  
ST FRANCIS DE SALES**

Today we experience Jesus as the Good Shepherd. He invites us to hear His voice so that we “might have life and have it in abundance.” St. Francis de Sales notes:

Our Good Shepherd gathers us all around Himself to keep us always under His protection. He tenderly nourishes us with His love. So loving is God’s hand as it handles our heart, bringing it strength without depriving us of freedom. Those who hear well His voice never lack holy inspirations in order to live life in abundance and to fulfill in a holy way their responsibilities.

To hear well we must listen. To hear the word of God, we must first be attentive to it by having an open heart. To listen to God’s word we must learn it well and carry out what we are taught. When manna fell from Heaven, the Hebrews rose each morning to collect it before sunrise. They ate and swallowed it so as to be nourished and strengthened. We too must digest well God’s word to make it part of our own being.

Thus, each day nourish yourself with a little spiritual reading that affirms God’s word and sends you on your way to your everlasting welfare. Let the word of God that you hear, speak to you throughout the day. Put that into practice and leave the rest to Our Savior, who nurtures your true needs. If we are to have life in abundance eternally, we must hear the voice of Our Shepherd, who guides us if only we let Him.

Since we easily mismanage ourselves, Our Shepherd wants to teach us how to have life in abundance through loving His voice rather than the voice of strangers, who easily lead us astray. True love is when we live in light of Our Savior’s love, rather than the selfish loves that the culture stresses. How happy we will be if we remain in the Shepherd’s presence, faithfully listening to and living His voice!

*Mandatory For New Volunteers*

The Diocese of Venice is committed to provide a safe environment for children and vulnerable adults. To that end, persons working with children or visiting vulnerable adults, as well as any volunteer for any ministry, are required to be finger printed (this process includes a background check) and to receive training in recognizing potential signs of abuse. The training portion can be done in your home over a PC.

# Begin again... Anytime

We often let our own pasts get the better of us. Shame for our sins, discouragement from having failed before, fear of making changes...these things can weigh us down and prevent us from making progress.



We may tell ourselves that we'll make a new beginning "when circumstances are different, or when the right time comes." But the right moment never seems to come, and in the meantime, we coast along without direction.

The Lord doesn't want us to live in fear of the future or in shame over our past. He calls us to start again. His desires to wash away the sins of our

past, and to guide our future with His Providence. We must follow Him now, not later. Rather than giving in to discouragement, we must allow Him to complete the good work that He has begun in us (Philippians 1:6).

We must begin again.

## Nunc Coepi: Motto of the Saints

The phrase "nunc coepi," which means "now I begin," perfectly encapsulates the call to a new life in Christ. These simple words hold the secret to consistent progress in the spiritual life. St. Francis of Assisi, St. Josemaría Escrivá, and Venerable Bruno Lanteri all show us the way to Christ through a ready willingness to start over.

Our Lord invites us to serve Him and follow Him now, in this immediate moment, without delay. He does not wait for us to be perfect, or to be in the right mood, or to have the ideal physical and spiritual tools. We may feel regret towards what we have or haven't done in the past, but these emotions and preoccupations don't change what God asks of us now.

Discerning God's will and striving to do it in the present moment is a key part of beginning again.

Firstly, God has already told us exactly what He wants from us through the revelation that has come to us through Scripture and the Sacred Tradition of the Catholic Church. The Ten Commandments, the Precepts of the Church, and all the moral teachings of the Church: these are the things that God asks of us. We are called to know what these teachings are and to live them as well as we can. If we fail in some way, we absolutely should not give up in despair; we simply renew our efforts to uphold the laws of God.

Once we know how God has called us to live in regards to morals and sacred obligations, we are ready for the next question: how can we know what God wants from us in the present moment?



Most of the time, our individual vocations and responsibilities show us very clearly what God's will is for us. Venerable Lanteri wrote about this when giving advice:

**"God has placed me in this state of life; in this and no other I must serve him and be saved. All the circumstances and events in my state of life, such as the different characters of the persons with whom I interact, the events that take place, the times and places in which these occur, reveal the order of Providence through which the Lord has willed to work my salvation. I must adapt myself to all these things and not think that I can force them to adapt themselves to me. And so, I will try always to adapt to these with peace and joy of heart, confident that God knows better than I what is best for me."**



## Knights of Columbus

**"Life is a gift"**

With this theme in mind, Katie Yoder authored an article for the Knight's Magazine "The Columbian" about the 53rd annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. on January 23rd. Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly, members of our Board of Directors and thousands of Knights and their families joined with tens of thousands of pro-life advocates from across America in the Nation's Capital to support the Right to Life.

The annual marches began in 1974, in response to the U.S. Supreme Court's 1973 *Roe v. Wade* decision, which legalized abortion nationwide. The 2026 march -- the fourth held since the Court overturned *Roe* in 2022—emphasized the inherent dignity of every human person beginning at conception with the theme "Life is a Gift."

Speakers at the pre-march rally included lawmakers, pro-life activists, and religious leaders, several of whom marked 2026 as the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, which recognizes a right to life.

Jennie Bradley Lichter, president of the March for Life Education and Defense Fund, read a message from a former marcher – Pope Leo XIV. "I send warm greetings to those of you taking part in the 2026 March for Life. By advocating for the unborn, please ensure that you are fulfilling the Lord's Command to serve Him in the least of our brothers and sisters. "Mathew 25: 31-46".
